Dr. Deborah Allen Named InterFaith Medical Director

Since coming to Knoxville 14 years ago, Dr. Deborah Allen has been a volunteer physician at InterFaith Health Clinic. As a member of InterFaith's Medical Provider Committee, Dr. Allen was always one of the first to know when the medical director's position was open, and more than once she was asked to apply for the vacancy. Four times she turned down the offer, but when Dr. Laurie McLemore left the position in July of this year, Dr. Allen applied. She felt that this was her time, and on September 22, she became the seventh permanent medical director of the clinic.



Dr. Allen brings not only a working knowledge of InterFaith but also an impressive resume. She received her undergraduate degree in biology from West Virginia University and her MD from the Medical College of Virginia. She interned, served her residency, and was Chief Resident at the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. (She is proud of her medical training in two of the South's finest cities—Richmond and Charleston.) She was on staff at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine in Wake Forest, North Carolina for one year and then in private practice in Virginia for seven years. Prior to accepting her new position, she was a member of the Summit Medical Group at Farragut.

She is married to Dr. Tony Allen, a musculoskeletal radiologist at UT Medical Center. They have three children. Son Mark and daughter Kathryn both attend the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. The Allens' younger daughter Anne is a first-year student at the University of Virginia. Dr. Allen admits that when the Allen household became an "empty nest," she became more attracted to the medical director position.

When asked about her immediate challenges, Dr. Allen says she feels some pressure to increase the number of patients she sees. She explains that most patients want their one visit to cover a number of medical concerns. She does not enjoy rushing patients' visits; so she says the solution is to learn to work faster without being in a hurry.

She also mentioned the rapidly approaching implementation of a new electronic medical records system and the need to train staff and volunteers on how to use the new system. Additionally, she has to replace a nurse practitioner who will be leaving the clinic at the end of October. One of her primary goals is to increase the number of volunteer physicians at the clinic. As she says, "This gives us more company in the trenches."

Dr. Allen enjoys travel and reading, and she says she "cooks a lot." (According to the nurse practitioners for whom she recently prepared dinner, her cooking is exceptional.)

Her primary off-duty interest is gardening. She is a member of the UT Arboretum Society as well as the UT Friends of the Gardens. Since 1997, she has made six French garden tours to gardens in Brittany, Provence, Paris, the Riviera, and the Loire Valley.

Dr. Allen says she is very happy to be at InterFaith Health Clinic in her new role. She considers this a "mission" rather than a job. Her prior experience and knowledge of the clinic make her uniquely qualified for her new responsibilities. Enthusiasm for her appointment is expressed by staff, colleagues, and board members alike. Dr. Debbie Allen's passion for InterFaith's mission is apparent, and we welcome and wish her well as she assumes this important leadership position.
