Bruce Pearl Teams Up with InterFaith at *Hoops for Health* Fundraiser

While most college students consider basketball a means of exercise or entertainment, a group of philanthropy-minded UT students recently turned the sport into a way to raise money for InterFaith. The *Hoops for Health* fundraiser was sponsored by University of Tennessee Hillel, a student-run organization affiliated with the Knoxville Jewish Alliance. A second-annual event, *Hoops for Health* was held on April 13th-14th at the HPER building on UT's campus and raised \$1,000 to provide health care for the low-income, working uninsured. UT men's basketball coach Bruce Pearl was on hand to observe the final games and present the trophy to the winning team. Pearl also autographed basketballs, photographs, and *Hoops for Health* t-shirts.



Hoops for Health was a 3-on-3 basketball tournament open to both genders. The initial games were held on Sunday from 1 pm – 6 pm, with the finals being held the following day. Overall, a total of 50 teams participated in the tournament, with the team "Gumdrops & Lollipops" winning the overall tournament. Sponsors of the event included Orange Nation, World Travel Tags, and the Knoxville Jewish Alliance.

"It's been a thrill working with the kids on this to support such a great organization and to help Hillel create more visibility on campus," said Deborah Oleshansky, the director of UT Hillel. "I'd like to especially thank Coach Pearl and his staff for their help with the event."

All I can say is God provides a way, as I know, but I just didn't know how He was to provide. So again, thank you for the help and thank you for being so nice and that includes everyone I have worked with at your office. Just had to write and tell you I didn't take it for granted.

M*A*S*H BASH RAISES \$75,000 FOR INTERFAITH



InterFaith's 14th-annual signature fundraiser, *M*A*S*H Bash*, raised around \$75,000 this year to provide health care for Knoxville's working uninsured. About 375 InterFaith supporters turned out for this year's event, which borrows its army theme from the 70s hit TV show *M*A*S*H*.

The Knoxville Convention Center served as the venue, with music provided by the Chillbillies. Major sponsors of the event included Regal Entertainment Group, BlueCross BlueShield of Tennessee, Pilot, Buck & Linda Vaughn, and PAETEC.


In addition to enjoying a delicious buffet and dancing to the eclectic music of the Chillbillies, guests engaged in a friendly bidding war at the live and silent auctions. More than 20 silent auction items (including gift certificates, golf packages, glassware, gift baskets, and more) were purchased, with the following live auction items also up for bids:

- Two-night stay at the Lodge at Buckberry Creek
- Pat Head Summitt signed basketball
- Tennessee National Golf Package

Money raised from the live and silent auctions, in conjunction with ticket sales and sponsorships, totaled about \$75,000. Melissa Knight, InterFaith's Executive Director, said the proceeds would provide for about 1,875 patient visits for Knoxville's working uninsured population. "With the influx of new patients coming to InterFaith for health care, we're on target to treat more patients this year than ever before. The money raised at M*A*S*H Bash will help ensure that we don't have to turn anyone away," Knight said.

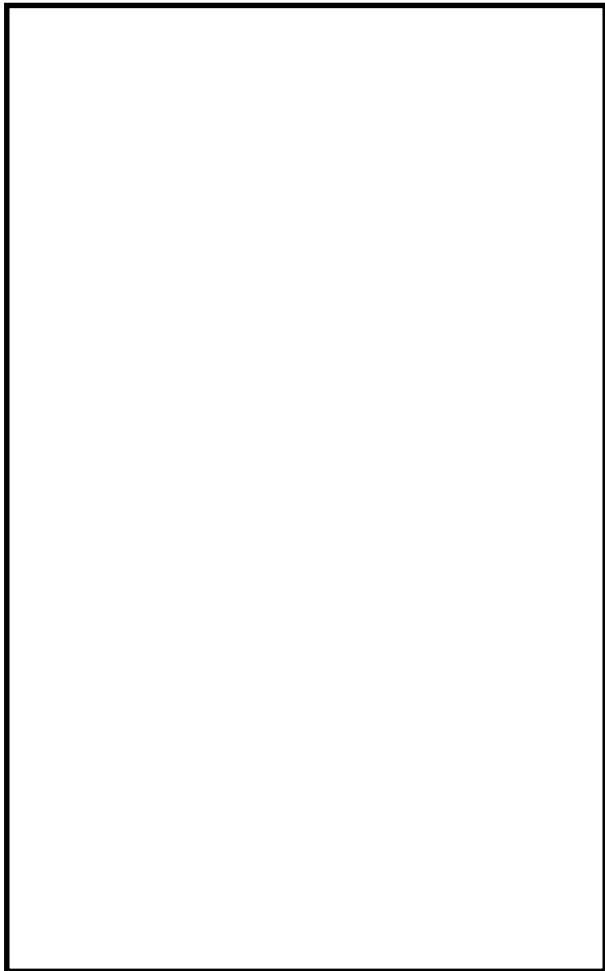

InterFaith's Medical Director Chosen for Physician Leadership College

Congratulations are in order for InterFaith Health Clinic's medical director, Dr. Laurie McLemore, who was recently selected as a member of the Tennessee Medical Association's **Physician Leadership College**. As a member of the College's "Class of 2009," Dr. McLemore joins 11 other Tennessee physicians selected for this honor and opportunity.

The purpose of the TMA Physician Leadership College is to provide physician members with experience and training in the core aptitudes needed to excel in leadership positions within organized medicine, medical practice and business. From April 2008 until April 2009, PLC candidates will undergo training sessions in collaboration and influence in the medical environment, decision making and conflict resolution, leadership and communication, and legislative advocacy, culminating in their graduation at TMA's annual meeting, MedTenn, 2009.

We asked Dr. McLemore three questions regarding her selection. Following are the questions and her responses:

What was your reaction when you found out you had been accepted to the Leadership College?

Dr. McLemore: *I know I was surprised. I had forgotten about the nomination, and had thought the college had chosen someone else.*

How do you feel about being chosen as a participant?


Dr. McLemore: *I realize that the Leadership College is not to make leaders of us, but it's a collection of physician leaders being given the opportunity to network with other physician leaders in the state. Without the College, I never would have had the opportunity to have this kind of networking. I am very proud of this honor.*

What do you expect to gain from this experience?

Dr. McLemore: *This College is not only about what we hope to gain from the experience but also about what talents we individually have to bring to the College. I am hoping that this opportunity will help me as the Medical Director at InterFaith to broaden my network with other physician leaders in the state of Tennessee.*



Dr. McLemore was named permanent medical director of the InterFaith Health Clinic in January 2006. She came to Knoxville after working at Cherokee Health Systems in Newport, Tennessee. Prior to the Newport position, she served seven years with Indian Health Services. She says she decided on a medical career when she was 16 years old, but she did not attend medical school until she was 30. She received her medical degree from the University of Missouri Medical School.

InterFaith is very proud of Dr. McLemore, an accomplished physician and a woman of exceptional talents.
