Fundraiser with TV Theme Raises \$80,000 for Uninsured



InterFaith's 13th-annual signature fundraiser, M*A*S*H Bash, raised approximately \$80,000 this year to provide health care for Knoxville's working uninsured. This year's M*A*S*H Bash, which borrows its army theme from the 70s hit TV show M*A*S*H, had a record attendance of about 400 guests.

The Knoxville Convention Center served as the venue, with music provided by Remedy, a Knoxville band made up of physicians from Parkwest Medical Center. Major sponsors of the event included BlueCross BlueShield, Pilot, Josephine Cochran, Buck & Linda Vaughn, and US LEC Now a PAETEC Company.

In addition to enjoying a delicious buffet and dancing to the music of Remedy, guests engaged in a friendly bidding war at the live and silent auctions. More than 30 silent auction items (including cookware, gift certificates, sports equipment, wine, artwork, and more) were purchased, with the following live auction items also up for bids:

- U.S. flag flown over Capitol Building
- Two-night stay at Buckberry Lodge
- One-week tennis camp at Bollettieri Tennis Academy
- Tennessee National Golf Package
- Four-night stay at cabin in Telluride, Colo.

Money raised from the live and silent auctions, in conjunction with ticket sales and sponsorships, totaled about \$80,000. Nina Bowling, Development Director at InterFaith,



said the money would provide about 2,000 patient visits. "With the changes in the state's health care system and the rising cost of private coverage, we're seeing a lot of new patients come to InterFaith for health care. This money will help us ensure that anyone who comes to us for help has access to the care they need," Bowling said.

InterFaith would like to extend our thanks to the volunteers and sponsors who made M*A*S*H Bash 2007 such a success. Your commitment to InterFaith translates into better health care for Knoxville's working uninsured.

We are truly blessed. With all the disarray in our world, our community continues to pull together to meet the needs of the underserved. Now, I don't want to give the wrong impression. Not everyone who is hungry will be fed today. Not all of the homeless will have a bed to sleep in. Nor all of those suffering from physical, mental, or emotional illness will be cured or even receive care. Some in our community that are teetering on the brink of poverty will not receive the little nudge to push them to financial stability and will wake tomorrow to find themselves in a desperate financial situation. All of these problems are bigger than any one of us or any group of us. But our community continues to get up and try. We do not throw our hands up and say, "It's too big. Let's move on to something else."



One of the ways that you – our generous community – have responded to those needing medical care is through the United Way Medical Home Initiative. This is a collaborative effort between Cherokee Health Systems, Knoxville Area Project Access, and InterFaith. United Way has funded a program that will disburse money to all three agencies to provide an additional 7,000 medical homes to the uninsured in our community. (A medical home means that a person has

their own primary care provider to take care of acute and chronic medical problems.) The money will be disbursed over a three year period and only if we meet certain criteria. As always, our local United Way is holding each of us accountable for how we use the hard earned money you have entrusted to their care. This initiative is a new endeavor for United Way. This was more of a grant process than the traditional allocation process.

All of this money must be used for *new* medical homes. None of it can be used for existing patients or programs. We are using the money primarily to provide more patient care during the hours of noon to 5:00 p.m. and make our disbursement of medications more efficient for the providers so that they can see more patients.

If you are thinking, "This is great, but InterFaith still has to provide care for all the patients they already have," you are right. If you are thinking that providing 7,000 more medical homes is only the tip of the iceberg, you are right. But it still proves that we as a community wake up every day to say, "What can I do now?"

Yes, we're fortunate to have the opportunity to participate in this new collaborative effort that United Way made possible. Yes, we are fortunate to live in a community that cares. But please don't stop. The need is still great, but you make the difference. It is all of us together that make this a great place to live. Your part makes a huge difference.

How Can I Help InterFaith?

Financial Support - One of the most important ways you can support InterFaith is by providing financial support. The average cost of one patient visit is \$55. Patients pay an average of \$15, making the cost to the clinic \$40. Every \$40 you donate will provide for one patient encounter.

More than 16 years later, InterFaith still depends on volunteer doctors, nurses, dentists, specialists, and clerical volunteers to help keep costs low for our patients and provide the very best health care possible. As the need for affordable health care continues to grow, however, InterFaith has also expanded its paid staff to keep up with the growth in the clinic's patient population. Whereas InterFaith was first operated solely by volunteers, the clinic has now grown to include a paid staff of 35. InterFaith is proud to welcome the most recent additions to our staff:

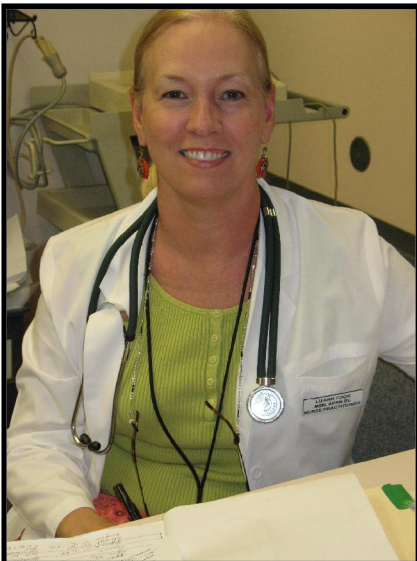
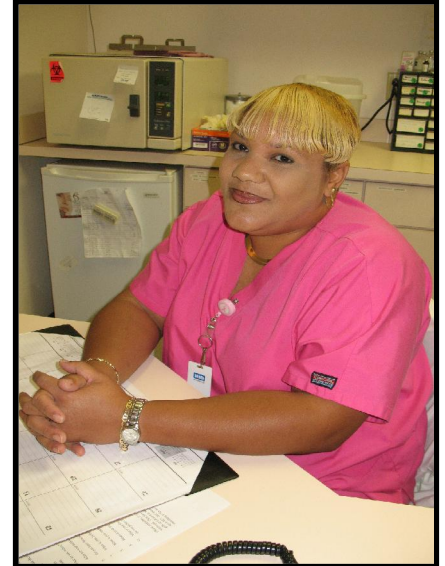


David Miller, Licensed Clinical Social Worker
